# Questionnaire

Please keep your answers brief.

What do you feel you can offer in this position that your opponent(s) cannot offer?

I am the only candidate or seated board member who has a background in Early Childhood Education. Our schools are falling victim to the education gaps that starts with a major deficit in children being Kindergarten ready. I operate a center that has a maximum ratio of 1 teacher to 15 students who are school aged, yet our teachers have classrooms with 25-40 students per class and cannot possibly engage them all and help with their emotional needs- something often overlooked as a teacher's role in this day and age.

How would you propose to pay for new schools and infrastructure necessitated by residential development?

We cannot continue to milk the well we currently pull from- additional funding is needed. I have no problem testifying to our legislators next session on the right all American children have to a free public education k-12 and those creating the budgets for us need to see that we don't have the money needed to support this growth. We also need this coming levy to raise local taxes to meet the needs of our students.

Briefly, how would you construct policy to deal with the following concerns?

Inclusion of non-core content such as music and the arts, social and emotional learning, physical education, debate, health, etc.:

Educating the whole child is of the utmost importance. Not all children learn best in a lecture-style classroom. Many children require movement and inspiration to retain the information necessary to be successful in school. These programs are the foundation of what our children need to grow into healthy, well-rounded adults. The core content has not proven worth the elimination of these tried and true programs in advancing our children's scores.

Student and Staff Security:

We live in a very scary time. Investment in door barricading devices to prevent an active shooter from gaining access to classrooms will save lives- a desk turned over will not. And I argue that if we invest in early learning (birth through 5) more, we will see less social/emotional issues in our schools and have less violent folk posing a threat to our students and teachers.

Environmental stewardship (recycling programs, sustainable building practices, low carbon footprint policies):

Should environmental stewardship policies be included in the curriculum or should these policies only be undertaken by district staff thereby setting an example for the student body?

Why shouldn't these practices be included in the curriculum? We live in a very Republican area with a lot of folks who think environmental concerns are hogwash. We need to inform the next generation of their responsibility to the future of our Earth by doing their part at home.

Inequity in special education programs to reduce student achievement gaps:

More teachers, fewer children in a class size. More paraeducators, mental health specialists, active classroom solutions to support children with hyperactivity disorders.

What will you do to build strong working relationships between teachers, the school board, and the superintendent?

The current school board has made a mess of these relationships. I am embarrassed at the way they have treated the teachers and I would be honored to help bridge the gap in that relationship if elected. Starting with hiring a great superintendent- one with a known track record of dependability, great communication and progressiveness to get our district in a position to retain our teachers and give our district a strong unified system that benefits the education of our students and fair treatment of our teachers.

Do you support bringing in for-profit companies to work with our public school children in our public school facilities?

No- our district needs to hire professionals in the industry to root themselves in our schools to establish trust and build relationships. When our own teachers are leaving for better paying schools down the road, no one should be profiting from us

What are your positions on the following: Achievement gap

Something needs to be done now- there are too many children falling behind. These gaps produce children who do not have the resources or confidence to break the poverty cycle they come from- it is an issue that is effecting our poorest children because their parents are busy working to death to keep the family alive and cannot invest in their child's education. It is a community responsibility- we owe it to these children to fix.

Prioritization in budgeting

Teacher wages, smaller class sizes, support staff

Division of responsibility and power between boards and superintendent

Board needs to take ownership of the lack of success on the core standards and do right by our students. While a unified board and superintendent can be strong leaders, when one is not performing, the other should not follow boldly and deny reasonable expectations from teachers and parents. The board and superintendent are only as successful as their educational system.

School funding and other state issues

While 50% of the state's budget is going to our schools, there is simply not enough money to meet our needs. The only way around this is to raise taxes and fully fund our education system.

Policing policies in schools

How many semesters of civics should be required in K-12 education, and in what grade should civics education begin?

We teach civics in our preschool classroom (developmentally appropriate, of course) so all ages should be required to integrate civic education into their curriculum. No child is too young to hear about inequities, racial biases, gay parents, the many disabilities effecting members of our community, the voting system, etc. It should be regularly integrated into elementary classrooms throughout the year. Beyond that, there should be regular offerings in junior and senior high schools for course options. I am unsure of the specific courses required currently per year, so I cannot provide a specific number of how many semesters.

Do you believe these subjects should be included in the curriculum?

Second languages are best introduced in the early years (birth through 3) and are very difficult to learn fluency in the later years. While language is a great intro to cultural diversity, classes specifically about other cultures would be better for producing young adults who have fewer racial biases.

Children need to have a basic understanding of anatomy before they can grasp the harm of drugs physically, and unless they've experienced drug abuse in their household, they may not grasp the emotional effects until later elementary grades  How many hours per semester should be dedicated to this? Unsure- I would need to see research on this topic to make an informed decision.
