Chair's Message

On June 20th and 21st in Spokane the Washington State Democrats held their biannual convention. The party platform was discussed and passed as well as several resolutions that lay out what the Washington State Democrats stand for. I want to thank three members of the 25th LD Democrats for taking on extra responsibilities and representing the 25th LD on three convention committees. David Henry this year served on the credentials committee, Eric Herde worked on revision of convention rules on the rules committee prior to and at the convention, and Eric Renz was on the platform committee.

The committee that requires the most preparation is the platform and resolutions committee. This year Eric Renz was our representative to the platform and resolutions committee which is charged with thoroughly reviewing and revising the State Party Platform; and reviewing and/or revising, then recommending whether to pass or not pass over a hundred resolutions submitted by Democratic LD and County organizations across Washington State. Eric Renz attended multiple meetings prior to the convention and spent several hours reviewing platform planks and resolutions, as well as the committee meeting at the convention. I thank David Henry and Eric Herde, and give extra thanks to Eric Renz because after taking part in the convention as a delegate I can see how much work is involved in the platform and resolutions committee. The 25th LD was allowed seven elected delegates plus our two state committee representatives, the LD chair, and our Democratic State Representative for a total of 11 delegates to the state convention. Our seven elected delegates were elected by 25th LD voters at our Legislative District Caucus in March. At the convention the delegates heard from Governor Jay Inslee, U.S. Representatives Suzan DelBene, Denny Heck, and Derick Kilmer, and several other elected Democratic officials and Democratic candidates. Our delegates took part in an often lively discussion on the convention floor and successfully passed the platform and many resolutions. This was not easy because it was a beautiful day in Spokane, the Blue Oasis in the desert of red Eastern Washington.

Renewing the State Platform

It was my joy and then my advantage to be on the Pierce County Dems platform committee for 2014. The research and conversations really fed my head. As things turned out, they also prepared me to create my personal platform for my election campaign. To briefly introduce and review the Platform work, I first offer the full text of the preamble. This is OUR preamble as we organize and campaign as Washington Democrats.

Preamble

As Democrats we place the well-being of the people as our highest priority. We believe in the values of community, empathy, equality, tolerance, opportunity, and the common good of the interdependent world we share. These values provide the basis for our ideals and are supported by our state and federal Constitutions.

Our actions define our society, our freedoms, and our responsibilities. To fulfill the potential of our values and ideals, we encourage every citizen to participate in civic activities, including continuously raising awareness of the issues contained within this Platform. The people have a right to expect their elected representatives to govern in a manner that will protect and promote their civil liberties, human rights, and quality of life.

We invite everyone to join with us in advocating for legislation that ensures peace, prosperity, liberty, and justice for all.

We expect elected Democrats to publicly and actively work to bring the principles of this platform to fruition using all available legal and parliamentary procedures.

The primary change here is the addition of the last line. The Platform has long called for every citizen to raise awareness of the Platform's values. The Convention added a call for elected Democrats specifically *to publicly and actively work to bring the principles of this platform to fruition.*

The Convention approved various revisions and additions to the platform:

The Agriculture plank got added emphasis on water quality and aquaculture.

The Corporate Power plank added a denial that corporations had the rights of persons regarding campaigns and elections.

A call for addressing student debt was added to the Economic Justice plank, as well as a call for a state bank.

More climate crisis material was added to the Energy Plank.

While calling for continued immigration reform and justice, the Immigration plank also opposed the use of immigrant visas to replace available US workers.

The Law and Justice plank was strengthened in its resistance to the Patriot Act and its support for stricter gun transfer and sale controls.

Both the Transportation and Environment planks addressed coal and oil train problems.

The Platform is intended to be a long-term statement of principles. Resolutions address issues that call for action now to make a change now. There were well over 100 resolutions submitted from Democratic organizations. Those that passed are accessible on the WA Dems website. Resolutions on coal and oil train issues and the death penalty that originated from the 25th LD were passed by the Convention.

It is a good education and awareness exercise to visit the WA Dems website and read the texts of our self-declared purposes.
