

And the great news is we netted \$600 on the dinner and silent auction.


**LOUIS TIBBS**  
**25<sup>th</sup> LDD VICE CHAIR**

Louis Tibbs had a tough 2008, but he is looking forward to 2009 with renewed enthusiasm.

In June, Tibbs was diagnosed with prostate cancer and then when he had the biopsy, he developed a blood infection, e-coli and was confined to the hospital. On Father's Day a blood clot formed and so the surgery to take care of the prostate cancer was put off until December. "I'm a type A personality and that was the longest time in 36 years I've been off work," said Tibbs.

Fortunately the surgery was successful and Tibbs is back in action! He is excited about 2009, but concerned about the budget cuts that the field of education is facing. Tibbs is the Elementary Literacy Instruction Coach for the Puyallup School District and works with all 22 elementary schools and principals in the district.

He thinks 2009 is a great opportunity for the 25<sup>th</sup> LDD to reach out to people. "There were so many new voters in this election. People that were not politically inclined, but excited for ei-

ther Obama or Clinton. This would be a lost opportunity if we do not, within the first six months of this year, reach out, contact people, send them newsletters, link them to our website, and get the word out. We need to get the new voters to understand it isn't something just every four years to get involved in."

He said we have a new batch of voters who used to feel disenfranchised, and now feel involved and we need to keep that going.

Tibbs organized Puyallup for Obama long before many had jumped on the bandwagon. "I started with small groups of people meeting for coffee and then at the Summer and Puyallup library, bringing new voters in and getting voters registered to vote. That group of people are the ones we need to keep active, before they disappear into the woodwork," said Tibbs.

**Report to the 25<sup>th</sup> LDDO Membership on the  
Pierce County Democratic Party Central Committee  
General Meeting 01-08-2009

A major portion of the meeting was an interview of the two candidates for State Party Chair, challenger Mark Hintz and current Chair, Dwight Pelz.

The candidate interview was conducted as follows. Each candidate was given five minutes for an opening statement. Each candidate was then given two minutes to respond to questions previously submitted by members, with a twenty second rebuttal allowed, if needed.

Mark is the Chair of the Snohomish Co Dem's and past chair of the 39<sup>th</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> LD's. Dwight is the current State Party Chair. Dwight won the coin toss and went first. PCDCC Chair Nathe Lawver then asked a series of questions.

I will leave it to the PCDCC Sec to report on the individual questions and answers in the meeting minutes. Here are my personal impressions of the candidates.

Mark is a consensus builder who believes in setting goals to produce achievements. He will seek 'committee-style' input and then try to coordinate a response to deal with a 'top-three' list of identified issues/problems such as disenfranchised voters or RCV.

Mark's platform is "Accountability, Transparency and Inclusivity". He would call on strong party members to help train less effective members and expand year round staff at the state level to be used as a core for the coordinated campaigns. (He did not address where the money for this expanded staff would come from.)

Dwight sees politics as a 'secular church' consisting of layers of participants. In this vision, the state party is the icing on the layer cake of elected Democrats, Labor and Activist groups, on-line Dem's, donors, the coordinated campaign and core legal support. He sees the next two years as a critical period for the state party as the economy declines and revenues fall. Dwight noted the Obama campaign has plans to hire several hundred staff to be a shared resource as part of the DNC, so the state should focus on retaining Internet support and Vote-Builder resources. Core legal support would be reserved for issues that held the potential for statewide impact.

Dwight sees the next big national issue as the Obama health care initiative. At the state level, we need to address the Red-Swing-Blue voter issues to increase Democratic voter turnout. As for RCV, "I hate it! Party politics make it easier for the average voter to decide on candidates and issues."

Dwight made an interesting observation, noting the average age of members at the LD level was the early 60's while fund raisers drew an audience in their mid-40's and the coordinated campaign volunteers were in their mid-20's; so the Dem's offer a task for everyone, regardless of age.

Our State Committee Man and Woman (Jerry Beckendorf and Ellen Zulauf) will cast their votes on January 24<sup>th</sup>. I would urge they support our current Chair, Dwight Pelz. Dwight admits he has stepped on some toes over the past couple of years, but he has also produced strong results.

We face lean times and strong leadership will be an asset for all Democrats.
