**Puyallup Council-at-Large** – Kathy Turner



#### "Are You Mad as Hell at President Bush and his Republican cronies in Congress"

If you haven't written Senators Patty Murray or Maria Cantwell or Congressmen Adam Smith, Norm Dicks or Dave Reichert, you should. Letters especially should go to Dave Reichert because he blindly supports Bush's Iraq War and Bush's corporate buddies. Also, see the Children's Health measure he voted against in this article. Be sure to write the Democrat House members who represent you as well.

Do you think that President Bush and V.P. Cheney should be impeached? Find out what your representative thinks and if you think otherwise, let them know. At a recent Edgewood picnic the 31<sup>st</sup> Democratic booth discovered visitors to the booth overwhelming supported impeachment.

Some current issues:

#### House Passes Collective Bargaining Rights for Federal and Public Safety Workers.

On August 5<sup>th</sup> by a vote of 495 to 13 Rep. Adam Smith helped lead the final passage of a House bill to fund the Department of Defense (DOD)

which included an amendment to strip funding for key provisions of a initiative to strip civilian workers of their collective bargaining rights. Adam has apposed this bogus national Security Personnel System (NSPS) since its inception and we should thank him for his leadership.

Last month the House passed the Public Safety Employer-Employee Cooperation Act of 2007 (HR 980) by a vote of 314 to 97. Adam supported this measure which would establish minimum collective bargaining rights for firefighters, police officers and other public safety officials. Included is the right to restricting strikes by public safety workers. HR 980 would require minimum requirements, even in the 20 states which do not fully protect these collective bargaining rights for public safety employees.

### Rep. Reichert Votes against Children and Seniors again!

Washington State Republicans, Reps Dave Reichert, "Doc" Hastings and Cathy McMorris Rodgers all voted against renewing and expanding the Children's Health Insurance program (SCHIP) recently. But despite their opposition, the measure passed 225-204 with all Washington State Democrats voting yes.

It now goes onto the Senate where it passed overwhelmingly. Senators Cantwell and Murray strongly support this bill because helped close down the privatization of Medicare and provide health coverage for children in low-income families. Current rules have cost our state some \$200 million over 10 years in SCHIP funds the state was forced to turn back.

#### Senate Passes Bush-backed Spy Rill

On a vote of 60-28 the Democratic controlled Senate passed a Bush-backed bill which will allow a maintenance of his domestic spying program. Offered by Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell of Kentucky, the bill would allow the administration to continue the warrant less surveillance but require it to describe to a secret federal court the procedures it uses in targeting foreign suspects. The Senate defeated on a vote of 45-43 a Democratic alternative which would have placed tighter controls on the spying and provided for independent assessments of the attorney General's implementation of the measure.

## Exercise Guru Richard Simmons pushes HR 3257 to provide PE in our schools.

Richard Simmons appeared recently on the today show and pleaded with citizens to write and call their Senators and Representatives to pass HR 3257 which would provide for more Physical Education classes in our schools. Because of school cutbacks, many music and PE programs have been scaled back or cut. The result is a more sedentary youth population
